- correct use of pronouns and punctuation of dialogue
- include reactions and reflections in your essay
- use flashback as an introduction technique
- describe your memorable event using descriptive language
- return to the flashback in the conclusion
- follow the 5 steps of the Writing Process (Prewriting/Planning, Drafting, Revising/Peer Review, Editing/Correcting, Publishing)

Remember:

You need a "grabber sentence" as the first sentence of your essay. This will get the reader's attention.


Your introduction needs to include a flashback to the event.

Each body paragraph needs a topic sentence, supporting details and a transition sentence to the next paragraph.

Your conclusion should again mention the flashback and then finish with a strong ending.
